

A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM KENYA

In our last issue, we introduced a young Kenyan girl named Joyce Gatonga. Joyce's education in a private girl's boarding school is sponsored by St. John's A.C.W.

The school is located in Meru, Kenya and is called the Materi Girls' Centre. Each year at Christmas, Brother John Koczka, principal of the school, sends a letter to the sponsors:

Christmas 1983

Dear Friends.

Materi Girls' Centre, our tenth birthday at the Centre and my own seventeenth year in Africa. To be honest it has also been a good year, thanks in great measure to YOU, for your sacrifice and encouragement. Academically our national examination results improved more than 100% over previous years, and the teaching staff has been strengthened by the addition of two new graduates, both local Africans. Again, we were able to give more needed attention to practical subjects like Home Economics and Typing, which pleased me to no end. Theory is fine, but we also need the nut-and-bolt studies too, especially here in the Third World and its rural communities. Popular is not the word for the School. Just a few weeks ago we held interviews for next year's primary class. Would you believe it: more than 1534 children, all with pencil in hand, turned up to vie for the only 80 places evailable in January, 1983!

This year we also added a beautiful chapel to the Centre, two new staff houses, and a lorry-bus, our dream-come-true, a bus that proudly reads, "A gift from our parents and friends." No, we didn't forget you. I'm also happy to say that the long-awaited Community Garden is now off the ground. The first twenty village families, all landless and unemployed, are now happily at work on their one-acre plots, plots that are watered and supervised by the Centre and its personnel. We hope, no we know the project will provide not only food and nourishment for the local people but also, and very importantly, much needed income and inspiration. Like the Child Care Unit which caters each month for over 1300 infants and pregnant mothers, the Community Garden is low-keyed but so vital. That the Centre and its many friends, especially YOU so very far away, care for this Kenyan community, believe me this is a Christmas gift all in itself every day of the year.

No, we don't need the latest Astroid game to keep us happy. Besides, where would we plug it in: But food, a healthy body, a little security and peace of mind - what gift could top these? In the coming months we must complete three new classrooms, increase the number of poultry as well as add a pig or two, and plan for our up-coming village seminar in nutrition and preventive medicine for the heads of local families in this area.

For your prayers, your love, your concern and your generosity, we say THANK YOU, THANK YOU again. Do have a blessed Christmas and Peace-filled New Year in 1984.
