

## LIEUT. CROSSLAND IS DEAD OF PNEUMONIA

Had Long Service Overseas in Infantry and Air Force—Home on Instruction Work.

Lieut. Ernest F. Crossland, R.A.F., died shortly before noon Sunday at his father's residence, 8 Crown road, after a two weeks' illness from pneumonia at the age of 23 years. After a lengthy service overseas both in the infantry and the air force Lieut. Crossland was sent back to Canada for instructional duty, and was posted with the 33rd Squadron at Leaside. Lieut. Crossland left Toronto in August, 1914, with the 3rd Battalion. With him was his twin brother James, who has since been invalided home to Canada and discharged. Lieut. Crossland went

to France with the first expeditionary force, and fought in the ranks for seventeen months, being once wounded. He was then given a commission and sent home to Canada to join the 208th Battalion. While at Camp Borden he was one of 100 men chosen to go to Oxford, England, to train for flying. For eight months he was flying on the Western front with the 45th Squadron, and, when returned home for instructional work, he was sent to the 208th Battalion, where he was an employee of the Bank of Hamilton.

**Capt. Quigley Dead.**  
Capt. Francis Quigley (Frank) Quigley, D.S.O., M.C., and Royal Air Force, is dead in England of pneumonia. He is the youngest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. Quigley, Toronto. His sister, Mrs. E. L. Lyon, resides at 166 Balsam ave. Capt. Quigley was awarded a bar to his Military Cross in May, 1918, when, according to the Engineers in France, he displayed "conspicuous devotion in aerial combats, destroying five machines and one balloon. He drove down four machines, showing splendid courage and initiative."
