

## Ban In Effect Only Small Part of Possible Measures

### Each Person May Be Required To Wear Harem Mask—or Handkerchief Over Face

Efforts already taken to combat the Spanish influenza outbreak in Winnipeg are but a small part of the action the health authorities are prepared to take in case of necessity to prevent further spread among citizens, according to information advanced today.

While other cities have taken more drastic action than Winnipeg to overcome the disease which has reached epidemic proportions, local officials believe they have checked the outbreak and for the moment additional orders are not being specially considered.

However, free injections of the serum brought to Winnipeg Saturday may be provided the general public. The authorities are debating the plan. While the serum would not be applied as a cure for influenza or pneumonia, it is held to be a preventive. Experiments in the south and east and the far west show that persons treated have not developed serious complications when they contracted the disease and comparatively few died.

In the event of rapid spread of the disease the entire city could be divided into sections, physicians and nurses could be mobilized and divisions placed in charge of each section. The scheme, the authorities say, would conserve time, as doctors would not have to treat patients in different remote districts, spending useless hours travelling on cars or automobiles.

As a further preventive, residents could be asked to wear masks and pneumonia jackets. Women throughout the city could be asked to make masks. Ten minutes are required in which to make a mask, but it requires about one and one-half hours in which to make a jacket.

The pneumonia jacket is a padded sleeveless garment which is somewhat similar to a close-fitting sweater. It is used to protect the back and chest. Predictions were made over the week-end that if every person in Winnipeg wore a mask for two weeks the influenza would be eliminated.

Prepared gauze masks are not deemed entirely essential. A handkerchief, if clean, would answer the purpose just as well as a gauze or muslin mask.

It would not be necessary to dip the masks in a preparation of sulphate of zinc. All that would be required would be to keep the masks perfectly clean. Any clean piece of cloth would do.

If the authorities decide to inject the new vaccine free a central office could be opened and branches operated in different parts of Winnipeg, the department said.
